




Growing a Behavioral Health Peer Network


Our Behavioral Health Resource Network (BHRN) Peers have played a vital role in connecting with community members who face barriers to treatment or services. These dedicated individuals not only provide basic supplies such as food, water and clothing, but they also work to build trust and understanding with the people they serve. By learning about individuals' needs and desires for change, our BHRN Peers can suggest services from Adapt and other agencies, coordinate those services, provide transportation, and assist with intake processes and follow-up care.

Our BHRN Peers specialize in various areas, including Unhoused Outreach, Crisis Follow-up, Tenancy Support, and Employment Support, each of which focuses on specific needs within the community. They spend time in areas where support is most needed, helping people maintain or attain housing, assisting with employment goals, and connecting individuals to essential services after a crisis. With the help of Oregon BHRN Grant funding, our dedicated BHRN Peers are creating lasting, positive impacts on the lives of those they serve, strengthening our community and inspiring hope for a brighter future.











Building Behavioral Health Workforce Stability

To address Oregon's behavioral health workforce shortage, the Oregon legislature passed HB 4004 to strengthen the recruitment and retention of Oregon's behavioral health workforce. Over the past year, new funding allowed us to review and update our organization's compensation structure to ensure fair and competitive wages across various job classes and categories in Behavioral Health, Mental Health, and Substance Use Treatment.

Our Human Resources team worked diligently with an independent financial compensation firm to determine market rates and establish a comprehensive compensation schedule that respects our commitment to pay equity and process transparency. As a result, many of our team members have received increased compensation, strengthening our organization's ability to attract and retain talent and fostering a supportive work environment. While we find our workforce is more motivated by purpose than finance, fair and adequate compensation is necessary to the long-term sustainability of our mission. This positive impact on our workforce has enabled us to better serve our community and further our mission to provide high-quality, evidence-based care to those in need.


Helping Build the Road to Recovery

We provide a full continuum of essential care for those dealing with substance use and co-occurring behavioral health disorders—ranging from medical detox and residential care to outpatient treatment and aftercare. Our top priority is to reduce the harms of substance abuse by helping people achieve lasting recovery in a nurturing, supportive, and healing environment.

Opioid Treatment Programs Long Term Support for Opioid Use Disorder

Our Opioid Treatment Programs continue to make a lasting impact on our community by providing life-changing medication-assisted treatment, combining medications with counseling, behavioral therapies, and community support to help individuals achieve long-term recovery from opioid use disorder. Our skilled physicians, nurses, and counselors offer comprehensive care, including medical and behavioral health assessments, methadone and buprenorphine treatment, trauma-informed care, and relapse prevention education.

In 2022, we served 515 individuals, guiding them on their path to recovery and restoring hope and health to our community. Our commitment to accessible care allows us to make a meaningful difference in the lives of those affected by opioid use disorder. By offering essential services and support, Adapt continues to play a vital role in helping our community members overcome addiction and lead healthier, more fulfilling lives.

Residential Treatment Empowering Lives, Strengthening Community Together


Our residential treatment programs build bridges to recovery through comprehensive detoxification and treatment services for adults and youth affected by substance use disorders. Our Detox Services team provided 279 community members with a safe, supportive, and healing environment to receive medically monitored and clinically managed detox services overseen by skilled medical and behavioral health professionals. This acute phase of recovery is crucial, as it ensures patients are safely detoxed and physically stabilized, enabling them to begin rebuilding their lives. Our youth residential center, Deer Creek, aided 29 young people in returning to a life of health and hope.

Our residential treatment center. The Crossroads, offers a structured and nurturing environments to help individuals continue their path to recovery. With dedicated teams providing individual and group counseling, family counseling, and skillbuilding programs, patients receive the continuous care and support necessary for sustained health and recovery. Our personalized continuing care plans create a roadmap for ongoing treatment, fostering community integration, restoring family relationships, and supporting access to essential services. Together, these comprehensive services demonstrate Adapt's unwavering commitment to empowering individuals and strengthening our community.

COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH

A Communal Effort for Mental Wellness

At the heart of our community's wellbeing, our mental health care teams are dedicated to providing comprehensive, evidence-based services for children, adolescents, adults, and families. As the Community Mental Health Program and a mental health service provider for Douglas and Curry Counties, we are devoted to enhancing access to the highest quality treatment and support services. Our skilled professional team of psychiatrists, licensed mental health professionals, peer support teams, case managers, and more work collaboratively with each individual to achieve stability, develop essential skills, and foster success at home, work and within the community.

Crisis Services

Throughout the past year, our Mental Health Crisis Teams have been a lifeline for individuals and families experiencing mental or emotional health crises. Available 24/7, our Crisis Services provide vital in-person and telephone support, prioritizing public safety and individual circumstances. Our Mobile Crisis Response Team partners with local law enforcement to address mental health crises, including suicide threats, public disturbances, grief and loss, family disputes, and potentially volatile situations.

In 2022, Crisis Services supported 1,369 individuals and responded to over 1,971 crisis calls. Our comprehensive assistance includes mental health evaluations, treatment determinations, and referrals to mental health services and other community resources, such as the Sobering Center. Accessible to all, our services have no age limits, insurance requirements, or eligibility criteria, ensuring that anyone in need can find the help they deserve during their most challenging moments.





Youth & Family Services

Our Youth & Family Mental Health services strive to promote mental, emotional, and physical wellness for at-risk youth and those already facing mental health challenges. Committed to providing timely and effective prevention, early intervention, and behavioral health treatments, our program brings together a skilled team of professionals, including Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioners, Licensed Qualified Mental Health Professionals, Therapists, Skills Trainers, and Care Coordinators, who specialize in treating youth and families. Serving children, adolescents, and their families in Douglas County, our programs work closely with schools, social service agencies, and community partners to ensure that mental health needs are evaluated and addressed through appropriate interventions.

In 2022, we served 999 clients providing 11,614 service visits, offering a range of services to help youth and their families develop practical skills for lasting health and wellness. Our offerings include individual, group, and family therapy, skills training, psychiatric medication management, and Wraparound. Through comprehensive assessments and treatment planning, we address a wide range of mental health disorders, with particular expertise in early childhood trauma. Our focus on early intervention and collaboration with community services ensures that we provide support that improves a child's functioning at home, school, and within the community.

Patient-Driven Success in Care


Community Health Centers across the U.S. deliver remarkable value to our communities, playing a crucial role in addressing service gaps for rural community members who struggle to access care elsewhere. Our dedicated clinical and administrative teams continue to provide top-notch care for patients. Our teams assist patients in navigating their healthcare, utilizing telehealth technologies, and offering same-day scheduling for timely access to vital services.

Over the past year, Adapt's patient-centered primary care clinics served 7,494 adults, adolescents, and children with 53,408 primary care and behavioral health service visits—both in-person and telehealth. We take pride in knowing that our work contributes to our community's wellbeing and bolsters the local economy through job creation, reduced healthcare costs, and increased access to high-quality care for all, regardless of one's ability to pay. It is estimated that Adapt's community health center has generated a total impact of over \$65 Million in community economic benefits and saved \$7 Million in Medicaid costs.




Youth Care Helping Our Most Vulnerable

Our dedicated team at Adapt is committed to providing high-quality care to all community members, from adolescence to adulthood. We recognize the critical importance of addressing healthcare needs during the formative years of youth, and we strive to fill in the gaps where families might struggle to find suitable care. Our range of services includes Well-Baby and Well-Child exams, teen and young adult wellness, and sports physicals, all aimed at promoting health and well-being among our younger patients. In 2022, we were proud to assist 1,076 adolescent patients in achieving better health outcomes, fostering the foundation for a brighter future.

Treatment for Opioid Use Disorder A Step Forward from Opioid Use Disorder

Medication for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) is an evidence-based treatment that combines medications with behavioral therapies. By offering treatment for opioid use disorder in our primary care clinics, we help bridge service gaps for rural community members who find it challenging to access care elsewhere. Our skilled and caring providers utilize medications in conjunction with behavioral therapy to empower individuals to manage their symptoms, focus on their treatment, and rebuild their lives. In 2022, 285 patients received life-saving medication-assisted treatment, facilitated by seamless in-house referrals to our specialized substance use treatment teams.

COMMUNITY SERVICESBuilding Bridges to Better Outcomes

We understand that lifelong health and recovery take root within communities, and it is through our regional community level efforts that we strive to build bridges to address social determinants of health. Our comprehensive approach encompasses community outreach and prevention efforts, housing and recovery treatment services, and peer support, all designed to reduce barriers to care and create

opportunities for individuals and families to build a healthy, fulfilling future.

Our work in tobacco prevention, opioid response, and programs such as Protect Our Children and Fresh Start, showcases our commitment to addressing health risks and providing accessible, evidence-based care for our community members. In 2022, we trained over 500 middle school students in vaping prevention, over 200 people in child sexual abuse prevention, and provided supportive housing and treatment for dozens of individuals and families.

Our comprehensive approach to care seeks to build bridges between various resources and agencies in our region, ultimately working to fill gaps in service and support for rural community members who face challenges in accessing care. We are honored to help our communities thrive through education, prevention, treatment, and support. Our ongoing commitment to innovation and collaboration ensures that we continue to help provide health, home, purpose, and belonging for individuals and families in need.

Supportive Housing

Adapt's supportive housing services, including Fresh Start, Eveningside, and Hillside Terrace, provide crucial support for individuals and families in recovery, ensuring they have access to a safe and stable home as they work toward long-term recovery and a brighter future. Fresh Start offers day treatment and on-site housing options for clients. In 2022, 29 people benefited from Fresh Start, with 44% moving into stable housing and 44% gaining employment. Eveningside and Hillside, our Family Treatment Housing programs, focus on reuniting families through the reunification process. Funded by grants and operated in partnership with the Department of Human Services-Child Welfare Program, these programs offer two-bedroom apartments for families and facilitate wrap-around services to support their ongoing well-being. Our supportive housing services are breaking down barriers to treatment and empowering individuals and families to build a stable foundation for lasting recovery.

Prevention & Education

Our prevention services play a crucial role in ensuring that communities and youth have access to education and resources to reduce the risk factors that lead to problem behaviors and increase the protective factors that support health and wellbeing. In 2022, Adapt's prevention team implemented vaping prevention curriculums in schools, trained adults to prevent child sexual abuse, and increased capacity for opioid prevention, treatment, and recovery activities in Douglas County. Through targeted social media campaigns, we are working to raise awareness about alcohol and other substance abuse, problem gambling, and suicide. By addressing a wide range of issues through various programs, our prevention services empower communities and youth to make informed decisions and create a positive environment for growth and wellbeing.

Peer Support

Our Peer Support teams play a crucial role in helping individuals on their path to recovery by providing personalized assistance from someone who has experienced similar challenges. Outreach Workers and Peer Support Specialists focus on connecting with community members facing barriers to treatment or services, offering basic supplies, building trust and making connections to essential services. Our Peer Support services focus on Unhoused Outreach, Crisis Follow-up, Tenancy Support, and Employment Support. By sharing their own experiences and expertise, Adapt's Peer Support teams help coordinate services, provide transportation, and offer support in obtaining housing and employment, all while fostering an environment of understanding and empathy.

Collaboration For Better Service








Clinical Excellence


Behavioral Health Workforce Stabilization


