

I am honored to be a part of an organization and community that have come together in a spirit of shared responsibility to achieve a vision of sustained health and well-being for all. Together we are making a difference.





peer power PREVENTION

Counded in 1982 to address the problem of substance abuse among youth and young adults, **Peer Power Prevention** has engaged a broad network of public and private partners to address substance abuse, problem gambling, suicide, bullying, and child abuse. All of our programs use evidence-based strategies to educate, empower and encourage youth and young adults to choose healthy activities and behaviors.

In 2014, the Peer Power Prevention team provided training and information to schools, parents and community groups about the dangers of substance abuse and how to help keep our young people and communities healthy and drug-free. Our education and outreach efforts reach over a thousand people each year through such programs as the Youth Media Project and Art of Prevention, The Blast 5k Run/Walk for Prevention & Recovery, and suicide intervention training.

Adolescent Outpatient Treatment

Treating adolescent substance use is a problem that can have serious and lifelong physical and behavioral health consequences. Adapt's Adolescent Outpatient Treatment Program provides specialized treatment services for adolescents and families of adolescents age 12-18 struggling with substance use and related issues.

Our services incorporate proven methods and personalized treatment to help adolescents develop the skills they need to live a life free of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs. Our skilled treatment team works in close coordination with parents, schools, medical providers, mental health providers, the juvenile detention center and others community partners to identify and offer the highest quality treatment to young people affected by substance use. In 2014, Adapt provided Adolescent Outpatient Treatment to **162** adolescents in **Douglas, Coos and Josephine counties.** building FUTURES

Deer Creek Adolescent Residential Care

Deer Creek provides substance abuse treatment for adolescents age 13 to 17 in a structured residential environment. Since 1989, Deer Creek has provided age-appropriate treatment to thousands of young people struggling with substance use and behaviors that make it difficult to function well at home, school and in their community.

Our highly-trained professional staff utilizes an array of evidence-based clinical interventions to "Adapt helped me grow and set boundaries."

address the root causes of substance use and to increase personal accountability, self-esteem and responsible decisionmaking. Our individualized programs include opportunities for academic education, as well as cultural and recreational offerings. In 2014, Deer Creek provided services to **46** adolescents, with an average length of stay of five months.

There is no single path to recovery. That's why Adapt's Adult Outpatient Program offers a variety of convenient and accessible options to help individuals and their families heal at their own pace. In 2014, Adapt's Adult Outpatient Program provided addiction recovery and behavioral health care to more than **1,300** residents in Douglas, Coos and Josephine counties.

Our professional and highly-skilled treatment team includes licensed addictions and behavioral health counselors, clinical social workers, child and family therapists and others who work with individuals and families to achieve and maintain abstinence from addictive substances.

The Crossroads

stablished in 1982, The Crossroads is a 30-bed inpatient treatment center for men and women with substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders. Care is provided in a structured, home-like environment that allows residents the opportunity to focus on their recovery.

The Crossroads utilizes an integrated treatment approach that includes primary medical care, mental health services, and specialized treatment for detoxification, chronic pain and nicotine dependence. In 2014, the professional treatment team at The Crossroads provided services to **132** men and women.

tobacco & nicotine RECOVERY

People who receive treatment for tobacco use and nicotine dependence are more likely to reduce their use of alcohol and other drugs. Adapt provides nicotine dependence treatment as part of our clinical standard of care.

Corrections Treatment Program

or over 30 years, Adapt's Corrections Treatment Program has made a difference in the lives individuals and families struggling with the consequences of substance use. Working in collaboration with Douglas County Community Corrections, Adapt provides a full range of outpatient, residential and aftercare treatment services to break the cycle of substance use, crime, and incarceration.

Our work with Douglas County's Drug Court continues to provide costeffective drug rehabilitation and education to address underlying substance abuse issues that contribute to criminal activity. In 2014, Adapt's Corrections Treatment Program provided substance use treatment to **271** individuals.

MOMS in recovery

dapt, in collaboration with medical providers, offers **treatment to pregnant women with a history of alcohol or drug abuse**, including prenatal and postnatal addiction counseling and assistance with complex psychosocial needs that may contribute to substance abuse.

SouthRiver Community **Health Center**

A Patient Centered Primary Care Home since 2006

ur mission is to provide timely and affordable access to primary, preventative, behavioral, and mental health care services to the community, regardless of one's ability to pay. As a Federally Qualified Health Center and a nonprofit program of Adapt, SouthRiver **Community Health Center** serves the primary and behavioral health care needs of people living in Winston and surrounding rural communities. SouthRiver has achieved a Tier 3 Patient-**Centered Primary Care** Home designation from the Oregon Health Authority —

recognizing the clinic's commitment to the highest quality, patient care.

In 2014, SouthRiver served **2.668**

unduplicated patients, emphasizing service delivery to those living at or below 200 percent of the federal poverty level and who do not utilize private health care insurance. Services are offered on a sliding fee scale to patients who might lack access to care due to limited income. SouthRiver is currently accepting new patients.

Licensed Behavioral Health Specialists are co-located at SouthRiver Community Health Center, North Bend Medical Center, Umpqua **Regional Medical Center and Evergreen Family Medicine.**
